Message From the City Manager



As we come to the end of the 3rd quarter for 2018, I am pleased to announce the city opened the Trotwood Community and Cultural Center.

Our Mayor and Council had a long range vision for the city to be able to offer a wide variety of enrichment experiences to the Trotwood community. Furthermore, the goal is to attract visitors from all over the Miami Valley Region that will enjoy art exhibits, concerts, classes, and other special events. In addition, citizens and guests will have the opportunity to rent this beautiful facility for weddings, holiday parties, fundraising auctions, and other special events effective Jan. 1, 2019.

This facility will be accessible for individuals with disabilities, and is available for meetings, plays and musical performances.

Roughly \$750,000 was spent on this renovation project that includes \$250,000 in grant funding from the State of Ohio and \$75,000 from Montgomery County Community Development Block Grant dollars. We are also excited about Central State University partnering with the city to locate a satellite office in the center that will provide opportunities, collaborations and/or expansion of 4-H Youth Development programs and educational seminars on various topics that relate to agriculture, engineering and scholarship opportunities within the city.

Finally, the Mayor, City Council, and staff are committed to providing Trotwood with quality enrichment experiences and want to thank you for your continued support as we work to revitalize and grow our community together.

Safe Prescription Drug Drop-Off Program

In response to the growing demand for a safe and convenient method to dispose of prescription medications, the Trotwood Police Department has established the Safe Prescription Drug Drop-Off Program and installed a drug drop-off box at their Department so that citizens can bring in unused and expired medications and place them in the drug drop-off box, at no cost and no questions asked.

Trotwood Police Officers check the boxes regularly, collect and inventory the drop-off box contents and prepare the prescription medications/items for disposal that is both eco-friendly and in accordance with local, State, and Federal laws.

The drug drop-off box is available to the public Monday through Friday 8:00 a.m. – 3:30 p.m. in the lobby of the Trotwood Police Department. The drug drop-off box is not suitable for large quantities of medications from medical treatment facilities.

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS FOR DEPOSIT

- Prescription Medications
- Over-the-counter Medications & Samples
- Vitamins
- Pet Medications
- Medicated Ointments/Lotions/Drops in leak-proof containers
- Inhalers
- Un-Opened EpiPens

UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS FOR DEPOSIT

- Thermometers
- Needles/Syringes/Lansets
- IV Bags
- Bloody or Infectious Waste
- Hydrogen Peroxide
- Aerosol Cans
- Empty Containers
- Personal Care Products

This program was designed to assist in the proper disposal of prescription drugs, in an effort to deter the usage of prescription medications by unintended parties, prevent harm to the environment (by keeping them out of public waterways), and raise awareness of drug drop-off box availability.

The Trotwood Police Department constantly strives to be proactive in enhancing public safety and saving lives, and appreciates your cooperation in doing so.
