Message From the City Manager, Quincy E. Pope Sr.

First, I would like to wish everyone Happy New Year! I am so excited about the progress and momentum we have moving into fiscal year 2023.

We exited 2022 with Trotwood voters approving Gas and Electric aggregation initiatives that will help our community negotiate lower utility rates for our residents this year. Furthermore, the community passed a five-year 0.5% temporary income tax increase to resurface and pave our neighborhood streets.

The city is also entering this year with another balanced budget that will allow us to continue to provide quality municipal services and work on strategic initiatives that matter to our community.

We are finalizing plans for the redesign of the intersection of Olive Road and Salem Avenue, where we will be installing sidewalks to ensure pedestrian safety and create walkable spaces.

We anticipate demolishing 33 vacant or abandoned residential properties throughout the community that will eliminate blight and help revitalize several of our neighborhoods.

2022 City of Trotwood Income Tax Filing Deadline April 18, 2023

The City of Trotwood has a MANDATORY filing requirement. The income tax rate of 2.25% applies to all who live, work, operate a business within, or do business within the City of Trotwood. Income tax returns are required for: all residents (regardless of income), businesses (including nonresident businesses and self-employed individuals who work in Trotwood), owners of rental property, and any other person required to file and pay the municipal tax determined by the Income Tax Ordinance. Trotwood's Income Tax office is located at **4 Strader Drive, Trotwood, Ohio, 45426.**

The income tax lobby is open for appointments; however, there is a limited amount of counter space. Therefore, we schedule up to two appointments at a time for privacy and security reasons. Appointments are set for 15 minutes, so please be on time. Current year returns will be completed at that time. Prior year documents will be taken if a prior year is needed to be completed and will be completed after April 18^{th.}

2023 NEW

As of November 2022, a tax rate increase was approved by voters, and starting on January 1, 2023, the new tax rate is 2.75%. Estimated tax payments are required if a balance of \$200.00 or more is due on your 2022 return.

NEW

Sports Gaming is taxable by the City of Trotwood and locations that provide the services are required to withhold City of Trotwood taxes from winnings and remit to City of Trotwood Income Tax Department.

A new service window has been installed for safety and convenience. Service window hours are, **Monday thru Friday**, **9:30 am to 4:30 pm;** appointments are recommended. Please call **937-837-3415** for appointment requests and questions.

Residents and businesses can also use the Income Tax Drop-Box, and a staff member will complete the return then follow up with an appointment. Extended hours and Saturday appointments will be available in April. Residents may utilize the City's Online Tax Tool to file their city income taxes at https://web1.civicacmi.com/TrotwoodTax/



Spring Safety Reminder to Residents from Trotwood Fire and Rescue Dept

Each year, more deaths occur because of flooding than any other hazard related to thunderstorms. The most common flood deaths occur when a vehicle is driven into hazardous floodwater. Fortunately, during a flood, you can take steps to protect yourself, and your family.



- Do not walk-through flowing water. Most drownings occur during flash floods. Six inches of swiftly moving water can knock you off of your feet.
- Remember the phrase "Turn Around, Don't Drown!" Don't drive through flooded roads. Cars can be swept away in only two feet of moving water. If your vehicle is trapped in rapidly moving water, stay in the vehicle. If the water is rising inside the vehicle, seek refuge on the roof.
- Do not drive around road barriers. Roads and bridges may be washed out or structurally unsound.

Trotwood Planning & Development and Code Enforcement Department Updates and Changes

Get ready to Cut Your Grass - Section 905.03 - LEGAL NOTICE TO CUT

Grass and Weed Season is right around the corner. Between **April 1 and October 30**, property owners are required to maintain their properties complying with *Section 905.01, 905.02* and *PMC §1345.04 (f) – Weeds and Grass of the Trotwood Codified Ordinance.* What does that mean?

- Keep weeds and grass UNDER eight (8) inches. Taller is prohibited
- Trim trees and shrubbery higher than twelve feet (12') over the street or sidewalk
- Pick up any debris around your property
- **IMPORTANT** if you fail to maintain your property, the City authorized by Trotwood Codified Ordinance will have someone cut/clear it for you at the owner's expense of \$300 (minimum) each time we come out. If you fail to pay the charge within 30 days of notice, it will be assessed to your tax bill according to ORC 731.54.6.
- LANDLORDS: you are responsible for ensuring you or your tenants maintain your property. Violation notices are posted on the property. You will be sent a notice to pay any charges within 5 days of the date cut.

Planning Office launches Online Permit Applications and Payment Service

Need a Shed Permit? How about a Fence Permit? Installing a pool this summer? Starting a new business? Permits are easier than ever to get with our new GovPilot online application and payment service. Permit applications are found at **www.Trotwood.org/planning-development/zoning-permits-applications/**. Just locate the permit you need and enter the data requested. After you are done, the application will take you to an online payment portal.

The Service eliminates paper applications and saves time processing so that you receive your permits faster and get your projects done. For more information on permits, please contact the Planning Office at 937-854-7227.

Trotwood Expands Code Enforcement Division

Code Enforcement team now has two full-time officers and one part-time officer to work with our community on complying with the Trotwood Codified Ordinances. They will be on the look out for Garbage and Debris violations, Unregistered Cars, Illegal Business Operations, Substandard or Dilapidated Housing and enforcing the Grass and Weed provisions of our code among the various other codes for property maintenance: Basic maintenance includes:

- Pick up any garbage or debris on your property daily.
- Put your trash cans away after pickup and do not put them out earlier than the day before.
- Wrap any furniture or bedding prior to placing it at the curb for Rumpke pickup.
- Contact Rumpke for Bulk pickup and bundling guidelines at 937-461-0004
- Fix any broken parts of your home such as windows, doors, and clean out gutters.
- Pick up any animal waste and dispose of it properly

If you see a violation and want to report it to the office, please go online and click on "Report A Concern" and enter the information. If you do not have a computer, you can do the same on your phone by downloading the App "GovAlert", this allows you to upload a picture too.

Please call the Code Enforcement Division with questions about city ordinances at 937-854-7222.

Trotwood Launches Police and Fire Online Payments

Need to pay a parking ticket or other violation notice from Police? Maybe you need to secure a special permit from the Trotwood Fire Department after an inspection. Don't have time to visit the office during regular business hours? No worries, just log onto the City's website, https://trotwood.org/online-payment/ select the Department you need to pay. Both credit cards or e-checks are accepted; have your ticket information handy, you will need to enter information from it.
